Stella Elkins Gallery and Tyler School of Art and Architecture are pleased to present CHROMA: A Thesis Show by Caroline Stoughton.

This show comprises a collection of paintings and drawings that explore the interaction of saturated and heightened color on subjects ranging from nature and landscape as well as moments from the artist's life experiences. These moments include those she remembers from spending time with her grandmother when she was young and moments from her travels throughout Europe.

Color is used to capture both subtle and profound qualities in her work.

Stoughton's work utilizes a variety of mediums: primarily oil and acrylic on canvas, a variation of applications of paint from thin washes to thick palette knife applications that hold depth beyond the surface, and paint, ink, marker and pastel on artists' paper.

Stoughton was raised in the suburbs of Philadelphia. Stoughton has studied in New York, Rome, Paris and Philadelphia and will be graduating from Tyler School of Art and Architecture in May of 2020 with her Bachelor of Fine Art degree in painting as well as a minor in Art History and certificate in Entrepreneurial Studies.

CHROMA will be on view from December 4th at 11 AM through December 8th at 4 PM. The daily hours of the gallery are 11 AM to 6 PM. A reception hosted by the artist will be held on Friday, December 6th from 6-8 PM.
